CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Entries

Entry fees are £48 per team per class or £12 per individual per class, inclusive of medical cover.

All classes are open to individuals and teams of 3 or 4 competitors with the best 3 scores to count. Competitors entered in a team will automatically be entered for the individual awards.

All entries must be made by the school representative on the official entry form provided (copies are acceptable) and should be sent to the secretary together with the appropriate entry fee. Entries by telephone or e-mail and those without payment will not be accepted.

Late entries may not be accepted. Subsequent requests to change horse and rider names may be made by e-mail until 29 February then in writing to the secretary on the day until the end of the preceding class.

Times will be available via the Bradfield College website (www.bradfieldcollege.org.uk, Activities, Download Documents) from 1 March or by telephoning the secretary on Friday 2 March between 6pm and 9pm.

Competitors must be pupils at the school which they represent.

This is a charity event and entry fees are therefore only refundable upon cancellation of the event.

No horse may compete more than once in each class. No rider may compete more than once in each team. No horse and rider combination may compete in more than two classes.

The organisers reserve the right to limit, refuse or eliminate any entries.

Formal, un-mounted prize giving will take place in the arena at the end of each class.

COMPETITION RULES

The ruling of the Judges is final.

All classes will be run as two-phase i.e. all competitors who jump clear in the first phase will complete the jump off course immediately without leaving the arena.

All classes will be run under BSJA rules with the exception of elimination upon a third refusal not a second refusal.

If the rider falls off they are eliminated and must not re-mount in the arena.

Any objection must be made in writing and handed to the secretary with a deposit of £20 within 15 minutes of the incident. The deposit will be refunded if the objection is upheld.

No horse/pony under 4 years of age may compete and no horse/pony may be led.

Anyone riding at the event venue must be suitably dressed in correct riding attire, with tidy hair and hats approved to PAS 015:1998, EN1384:1996, BSEN 1384:1997 with BSI Kitemark, Snell E2001 with official Snell label and number, AS/NZS 3838:1998 or the AS/NZS 3838:2003 standards shall be worn correctly fastened at all times when mounted.

It is strongly recommended that body protectors are worn when jumping.

Inappropriate or excessive use of whips/spurs will not be permitted and may result in disqualification at the discretion of the Judges/organisers.

Venue

Entry to the event venue does not entitle riders or visitors to use any facilities other than those associated with the event itself. Please pay attention to signage.

No liability shall fall on the organisers, landowners, judges or officials in respect of any loss, damage or injury howsoever caused and all competitors are deemed to be liable to indemnify the said persons in respect of any such loss, damage or injury.

The organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the Health and Safety of everyone present. Everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring, and must obey the instructions of all officials, stewards and organisers. Smoking is only permitted in designated areas.

No horses to be left tied up outside lorries or trailers.
All hay and droppings must be picked up.
No lunging, long-lining or galloping permitted.
