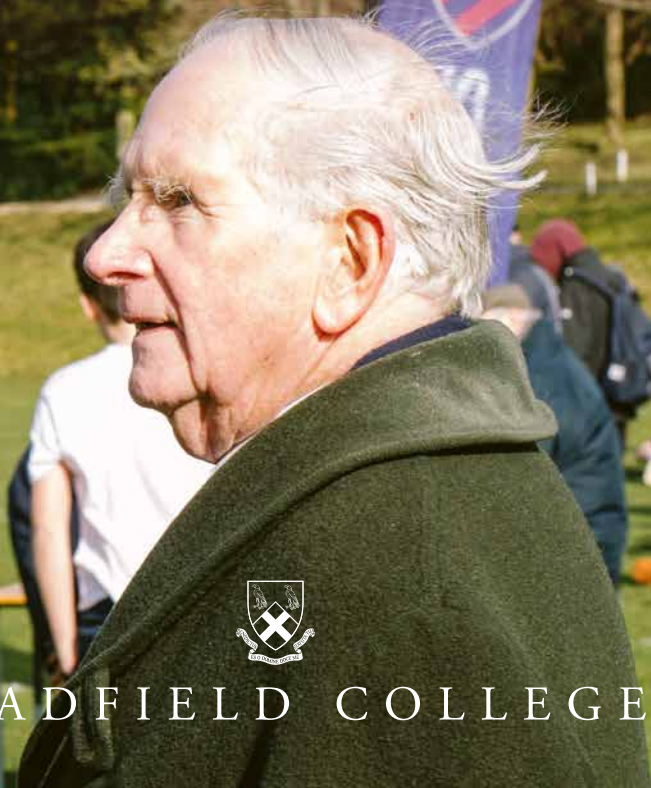

A MESSAGE FROM THE HEADMASTER

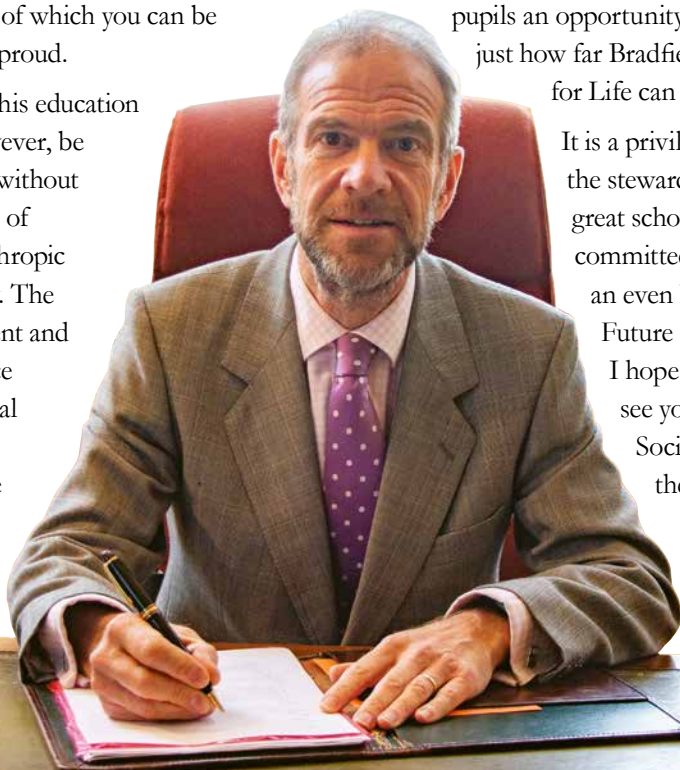

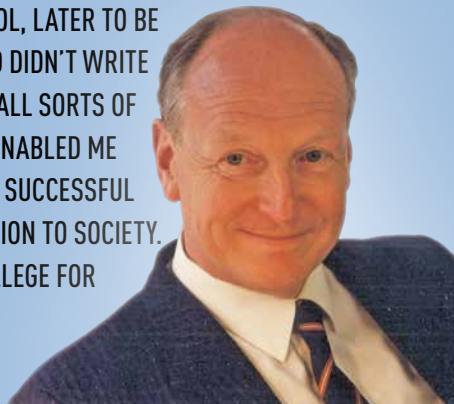

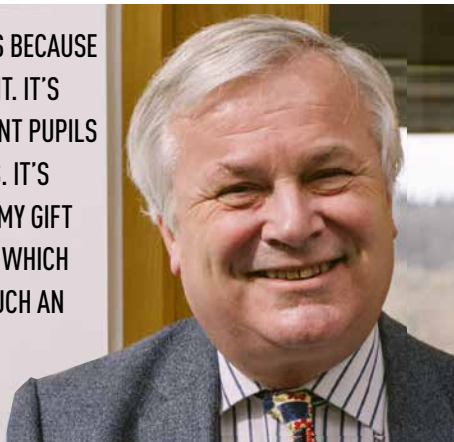
