COLLEGE CELEBRATES 175th ANNIVERSARY

Our 175th anniversary gives us the opportunity to celebrate the vision and courage of our founder, to look back at the early years of Bradfield College and to consider its development into the school we know today.

Whilst much has changed throughout its existence, the College archives and histories speak to an underlying sense of purpose and commitment to the transformative power of education that has allowed Bradfield, Bradfieldians and the wider Bradfield community to flourish.

We are delighted to unveil the Bradfield 175 timeline frieze in Bloods corridor commemorating many important moments in the College's history. There are also two books, the wonderful History by Stuart Williams and a more pictorial history edited by Oli Gent in the English Department that compares the 'then and the now', showing what has changed and what remains the same. We have also installed information boards at key historic locations, such as the Greek Theatre, as focal points for knowledge and appreciation of our heritage.

We will mark the anniversary by celebrating Bradfieldians. Whilst there is one Bradfield there are many Bradfieldians and this year we will be sharing videos of notable alumni who share why Bradfield is special to them.

Throughout 2025 we will host events to mark the anniversary. Some have stood the test of time; the College Steeplechase that began in 1920 is still



going, whilst we have dedicated others to the 175th anniversary. On 21 June will host the 175 Summer Gathering, a day when we encourage alumni to 'Step back in time', to gather with friends and take a trip down memory lane.

BRADFIELD 175 TIMELINE UNVEILED

Bradfield is delighted to unveil the Bradfield 175 Timeline which showcases the many developments and achievements of the College over its 175 year history. Perfectly situated in Bloods Corridor, it runs the full length of this historic feature and is a place where pupils, parents and the wider Bradfield community can learn about and feel proud of Bradfield's rich heritage.

Beautifully decorated with images and artefacts from the College's history, the timeline also features the bright colours of Bradfield's 'Education for Life' educational principles and has turned what was quite a dark corridor into a vibrant educational setting.

The timeline sequences the history in chronological order, starting in 1751 the date when the Stevens family acquired Bradfield Manor and lists interesting events, giving insight into the development of the campus, teaching, sports and pastimes – a formal and at the same time a more personal history.

The Timeline finishes in 2025 with the wall at the end of the corridor celebrating 'Bradfield today' with

This project was led by Karen Ward from the Bradfield Society with the support of Stuart Williams, current staff and author of the recently published Bradfield College: Prosperity Past Our Deserving and Dr John Cardwell the College Archivist.

In addition to the Timeline we have installed information boards around the campus at key historic locations, to act as focal points for College tours by pupils and visitors. Many thanks to current staff Roger Keeley for collating this information and to the Friends of Bradfield for sponsoring this particular project.



'MY BRADFIELD' VIDEO SERIES CELEBRATES BRADFIELD AND BRADFIELDIANS

In honour of the 175th anniversary we have released a special 'My Bradfield' video series that shares the unique stories of Bradfieldians, what made Bradfield special for them, their achievements and challenges and their relationship with the College today.

Our first video release was of actor Claudia Harrison (I 92-94) who was among the first mainstream entries of girls to the College. After Bradfield, Claudia studied for a degree in drama at Birmingham University before graduating from RADA in 2000. As a professional actor she has had a varied and exciting career, including lead roles in TV, film, theatre and radio. She was most recently seen on TV starring as Princess Anne in Seasons 5 and 6 of Netflix series *The Crown*.

In February we heard from Col Simon Cox RM (G 96-01) who has had a

varied military career including commissioning into the Royal Marines, qualifying as a pilot and deploying to Afghanistan. Currently working directly in support of the First Sea Lord, in his video Simon talks about the importance of strong values in service.

Other releases include BBC sports commentator Tim Dellor (G 89-94), newly appointed Lord Chamberlain Richard Benyon (H 74-78) and The Saunders Family who represent 5 generations of Bradfieldians, featuring current Bradfieldian Lottie Saunders and her brother Harry (A 18-23), current Housemaster and former radio presenter Jonny Saunders (F 88-93) and his father Chris Saunders (SCR 64-80). Before them Jonny's wife Kate's father Robert Roe (E 37-42) and grandfather Robert Roe (1899 – 1904) also attended Bradfield.



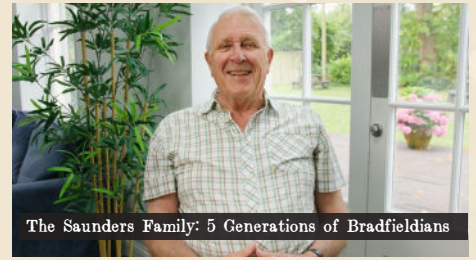

BRADFIELD ARCHIVE LOOKS TO FUTURE

The Bradfield Archive is the main repository for the historical records of Bradfield College, which embraces a diverse range of collections, dating from the seventeenth century to the present. In addition to conservation of the collection there is an ongoing project to digitise the archive, thereby making it accessible to all. Bradfield archive materials have been invaluable to the historical projects associated with Bradfield 175.

College archivist, Dr John Cardwell, has helped to research facts for the writing of the latest history of Bradfield, sourced photos for the pictorial celebration and will also be curating an exhibition of College artefacts for display during the Summer term.

WEDNESDAY 25TH – THURSDAY 26TH JUNE

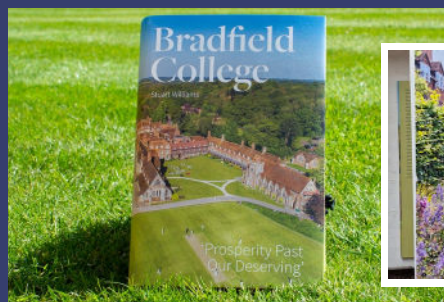

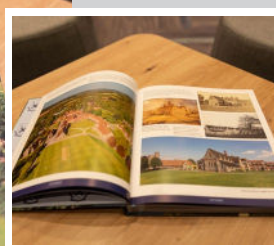
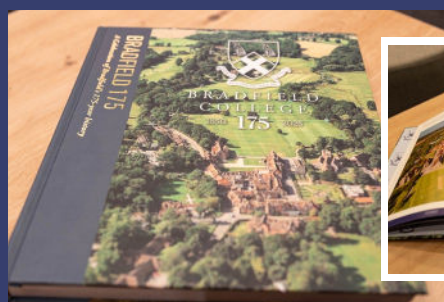
