Music at Bradfield aims to play an invaluable role in the development of each and every pupil, enriching the lives of all who come to the College. We encourage and enthuse those of all abilities, with enjoyment and excellence at the heart of our provision.

Our creative and contemporary Year 9 academic music programme lays the foundations for a culture of music that goes far beyond 'just' playing an instrument or singing. It enables students to learn skills for life and develop their sense of self, preparing them for any future employment. Each lesson, exam and performance that Bradfield's musicians take part in allows them to demonstrate commitment, analytical skill, creativity, discipline, confidence, teamwork, and so much more.

Music also possesses qualities that should place it at the forefront of all pupil's wellbeing, both personal and social, aiding their quest to better understand themselves and the world around them.

With a staff of active musicians at the heart of the department we provide a music education of excellence. The environment created allows pupils to enjoy expressing themselves with confidence and enables our excellent Visiting Music Teachers to inspire them with their passions and expertise.

We offer a hierarchy of performance opportunities, in as wide a range of genres, as pupils would like to be involved in, and take care of every facet from first lessons through to building websites and networking events for those wanting to enter the world of professional music.

What follows is a summary of the Music provision we offer at Bradfield. It is designed to inform prospective Faulkners' parents so they are able to choose, in discussion with their children before arriving at Bradfield, which pathway they would like their Music to take in their Faulkner's year.

INDIVIDUAL MUSIC LESSONS

How involved pupils are in the music programme at Bradfield depends on a variety of factors, including their other interests/commitments and, vitally, how important Music is to them. For that reason, we would like parents to choose, in discussion with their children before arriving at Bradfield, which pathway they would like their Music to take in their Faulkner's year:

RECREATIONAL

- lessons only 30/45*/60minutes as desired;
- participation in Faulkner's Choir/bands only and undertake independent practice**, at pupil's own discretion.

STANDARD

- individual music lesson 30/45*/60 minute;
- two monitored practice sessions;
- participation in minimum one ensemble/activity;
- Grade 5 Theory is available for all to sign up to.

Academic Musicians will continue this pathway into years 10 and 11.

SPECIALIST

- individual music lesson 45*/60 minute;
- minimum three monitored practice sessions;
- participation in minimum two College ensembles/activities;
- the opportunity to play/sing in one bespoke smaller ensemble;
- Grade 5 Theory by end of Faulkner's (if not already achieved).
- * 45minutes lesson duration recommended
- ** subject to practice room availability, most likely after 18:30 on weekdays only

Please note, this pathway choice will be reviewed throughout the academic year, in consultation with pupils, Tutors, HsMs and parents.


If pupils are contributing to the co-curricular provision of the department, they will find more performing and enrichment opportunities become open to them.
